
# HISTORY

# MISSION STATEMENT



Our Mission is Twofold.....

## CHWC AT A GLANCE

Your group will arrive at the host school on the first day of camp in the afternoon sometime between 12:00-2:30. You will probably be tired from traveling but filled with anticipation for the week ahead. You will first get situated in sleeping quarters (a classroom). Then the opening session will begin at 3:00pm with icebreakers, meet the Workcamp staff, and group mixers. Before dinner you will be divided into seven member work teams and meet new people from around the country. Each work team will have one or two adults, a male/female ratio, and be grouped according to skill level. You will then review your work assignments and directions to your worksite and participate in a variety of fun active learning activities. The evening will end with mass.

You will begin each day with breakfast at 6:45am, morning program at 7:30am, head to your worksite at 8:00am, and return to the school at 3:30pm. Each day you will spend time working at your assigned project with your work team. Depending on the area that you would have requested; home repair, daycare work or a social service center, you may be involved in some of the following areas of service: scraping, painting, yard clean-up, door repairs, window repairs, cleaning windows, removing trash or serving the homeless. Bringing joy to a resident! If you select daycare, you will brighten a child's day by playing, reading, and simply being present. We just ask that you come ready with a servant HEART!

After returning from your worksite, you will have time to shower, relax, or pick-up some games of basketball, frisbee, soccer etc. Daily mass is at 4:30pm (At "Next Level" camps rosary will be at 4:30pm, daily mass is in the morning), dinner is served around 5:15pm with a little more free time to follow. Then look out, you will experience a high energy, fun, inspirational program. Music, drama, prayer, personal stories, a teaching that will challenge you to serve, video of you at your site and much much more!

You will have one free day. You can choose an area attraction. There are plenty of fun things to do in all cities. You will receive information once you have registered.

On the last day of camp, Catholic Heart Workcamp will end with mass and a summary video of the week. You will be so excited to go back home and continue to serve!





## CHWC INSPIRES YOUNG PEOPLE TO GROW IN THEIR CATHOLIC FAITH

Young people and their leaders will be spiritually renewed after participation in the Workcamp, by putting their faith into action. They will be living out Christ's command to love and serve others. By participating in the HEART Workcamp, the young people and their leaders will be celebrating their Catholic faith. The Workcamp promotes the signs, symbols, stories and rituals affiliated with the Catholic Church. The sacraments of Reconciliation and Eucharist, as well as prayer services will be offered throughout the week to help young people become more aware of the presence and love of God.

Catholic Heart Workcamp is centered on:

- Faith and works: (James 2:17)
- Corporal works of mercy (Feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, clothe the naked, shelter the homeless, visit the sick, visit the imprisoned)
- Sacred Scriptures: Written under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit and have been handed on by the Catholic Church. We consistently refer to scriptures throughout the week of camp
- Divinity and saving value of the life, death and resurrection of Jesus: CHWC calls campers to renew their baptismal call on their journey of faith
- Parish life: Call to active participation in the life of the local parish and youth program. The Church is an assembly of faithful followers of Jesus as Lord.
- Mary: Call upon Mary for prayer and intercession. Belief in Mary's Immaculate Conception, as The Mother Of Jesus, her Perpetual Virginity, her intercessory power, and her Assumption into Heaven
- Daily Rosary
- Prayer: Belief in the power of communion with God
- Belief in the power of the sacraments
- Reconciliation
- Eucharist: The heart of our faith in which Jesus is fully present and alive
- Daily Mass
- Adoration ("Next Level" Camps)
- Saints: Role models of how to live a "holy life." Call upon the saints to watch and protect our campers
- Full conformity with the hierarchy, doctrines, traditions, rituals, practices and beliefs of the Catholic Church

**WHAT IS CATHOLIC HEART WORKCAMP?**

Catholic HEART Workcamp is about SERVICE, CONNECTION and LOVING OTHERS. It all started in 1993 in Orlando, FL with 100 participants and has grown to over 12,000 serving in 2012. CHWC provides parish youth groups, teens and adult leaders service opportunities to restore homes and HEARTS, feed the hungry, lift the spirits of children, bring joy to the elderly and disabled and offer assistance while partnering with social agencies. Each Workcamp is equipped with a summer staff, director, manager, musician, nurse and priests to celebrate mass/confession. It is a youth friendly Christ centered Week of caring for others. Catholic HEART Workcamp faithfully and enthusiastically serves the Roman Catholic Church and its teachings and is an excellent opportunity to "love the least of these".

**HOW DO WE START?**

Begin with a plan of action if you have not already. Ask for your free HEART Workcamp promotional DVD and show it to your pastor, adult leaders, teens and parents. Have a sign up sheet for those who are interested. Send in a \$75.00 deposit for each young person and adult. Send a follow-up letter to those who have signed up with a deadline for deposits. Have monthly meetings with those who have paid deposits to prepare, plan and build a community.

**WHO CAN ATTEND?**

The majority of our camps are open to any students entering the 8th grade in the fall through college. Our Middle School/High School Camps are open to students entering the 7th grade through college. Our "Next Level" camps are open to students entering the 9th grade through college. We require one adult chaperone (21 years and older) for every five young people. Please bring at least one adult male and one adult female if you are bringing both female and male young people. CHWC International Trips are open to those entering the 10th grade in the fall through college. Individual registrations will be accepted from College/Young Adults/Adults for **International Trips ONLY**.



**HOW MANY PEOPLE CAN WE BRING?**

We welcome groups of all sizes. Even if only a few young people participate, your group will have a great experience. We cannot accommodate individual registrations.

**HOW ARE WORKSITES SELECTED?**

We work in cooperation with various agencies in each city to choose the work projects. These agencies work to improve the lives of low-income families, children and the elderly.

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### **WHERE DO WE STAY WHILE AT WORKCAMP?**

Facilities at local schools/retreat centers will be used for lodging, showers and food service. Bring your own sleeping bag and air mattress. There are separate sleeping areas for girls and guys. There are no facilities or time allotted for doing laundry.

### **WHAT KIND OF WORK WILL WE BE DOING?**

Each day will be spent either renewing homes by doing such things as painting, housecleaning, yard work, minor home repair, helping to build new homes for low income families, working to revitalize blighted neighborhoods by boarding up or tearing down unoccupied buildings, cleaning up vacant lots, etc.; helping at day care centers for low income families by assisting with the children's programs, working at homeless shelters or helping at centers that distribute food to the needy. At some locations, volunteers spend time with the elderly in nursing homes and in homes for the disabled.

### **HOW WELL SUPERVISED AND SAFE IS THE WORKCAMP?**

The HEART Workcamp Staff takes supervision and safety seriously. Besides the Workcamp adult staff, each group is required to bring one adult sponsor for every five young people to provide supervision at the worksites and the school. The HEART Workcamp will not involve young people in any kind of dangerous projects. No one will be allowed to use power tools unless they are well trained and have previous experience. Every participant is asked to bring protective safety gear. Every young person is matched to a project they can handle. To compensate for the hot weather, work campers are supplied with plenty of liquids to drink and given frequent breaks. Each worksite is inspected by the agency. Home repair projects are well organized and prepared. First-aid kits and emergency care instructions will be available at every worksite. Medical facilities, phone numbers and directions are clearly posted at the school "Home Base." Every safety precaution is exercised to produce a safe and injury free atmosphere. On Sunday, all participants are trained in Safety, Rules and "What If" situations.

### **WHAT IF A YOUNG PERSON HAS LITTLE OR NO HOME REPAIR EXPERIENCE?**

As long as young people come with a servant's attitude, there is no problem involving them in home repair projects. We match skills to projects. There is plenty of work that needs to be done, such as painting, which takes little or no experience. Young people are not asked to participate in projects they are not equipped to handle but will be given opportunities to learn new skills if they so desire.

### **HOW WILL THE WORKCAMP HELP YOUNG PEOPLE GROW IN THEIR CATHOLIC FAITH?**

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**WILL MY GROUP MEMBERS BE MIXED WITH OTHER YOUTH AT THE WORKSITES?**

Yes, this is one of the beautiful aspects of the HEART Workcamp. New relationships and friendships are formed with other people from around the country. Most work teams consist of seven members. There is free time each afternoon and evening for the young people to socialize with their own group members. CHWC will accommodate groups that request their young people be placed at a work site with two adults. The implications of a youth group requesting two adults per worksite are as follows:

- Your group must stay together with members of your own youth group.
  - You must provide enough adults for your group to be split into teams with 2 adults.
  - You will create your own teams based on your vehicles.
- (Form Provided by CHWC)

\*Your campers could be split up if a particular camp is able to provide 2 adults for every work team, but if you would like to be kept together, that request will be honored.

**WHAT WILL THE MORNING AND EVENING PROGRAMS CONSIST OF?**

Our goal is to communicate that "OUR CATHOLIC FAITH IS NOT BORING!" The program at Catholic HEART Workcamp can leave you speechless! Why?

**WHAT ABOUT MEALS AND SPECIAL DIETS?**

CHWC works directly with a nutritionist and the menu is based on a well balanced diet that will provide all the nutritional and calorie needs of approximately 10-20% protein, 20-30% fat and 50-60% carbohydrates. CHWC does realize that there will be campers with food allergies, vegetarians etc. We feel we offer plenty of options for vegetarians but if a camper requires a special diet they are required to bring their own food or supplement what their diet requires.



### **HOW DO WE TRAVEL TO THE WORKCAMP?**

Most groups use vans or small buses to travel to Workcamp. We ask that these same vehicles be used to transport teams to their worksites. In order to abide by state law, vehicles must be equipped with seatbelts for all passengers. Participants will not be allowed to ride in open trucks or vehicles without seatbelts. If you choose to fly to a Workcamp location, you must arrange to rent vehicles that can be picked up upon arrival at the airport. To keep the cost of registration low, groups are responsible for all vehicle expenses. **12 & 15 PASSENGER VANS:** Safety and liability issues are forcing churches to abandon 12 & 15 passenger vans. In most diocese they are no longer permitted. Therefore, CHWC will no longer permit 12 & 15 passenger vans. Mini-buses offer a viable replacement option for transportation.

### **WHO NEEDS A BACKGROUND CHECK?**

Catholic HEART Workcamp requires anyone 18 and older, whether participating as a young adult, adult chaperone or camper to be in compliance with their Diocesan policy for interacting with young people as it relates to their sexual abuse risk prevention policies, training and background checks, in accordance to the U.S. Bishops Charter for the protection of children and young people. If you have a teenager who is currently 17 and will turn 18 before or during camp, they will need to follow this policy as well. All young adults (18-20) will be placed on a team with an adult (21 and over) as their group leader. CHWC also requires all summer staff to conform to a FBI National Background Check. CHWC staff will also be trained in the Virtus program, "Protecting God's Children" in order to be in compliance with the U.S. Bishop's Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People.

### **HOW DO THE ADULTS FROM EACH PARISH PARTICIPATE?**

Every adult is assigned to a worksite unless they have chosen to be an Associate Staff Member. We depend on adults to work side by side with the young people in accomplishing the work projects. For the safety of the teens, each parish must have at least one adult chaperone in each sleeping quarter. Catholic HEART Workcamp also depends on adults to supervise their own parish young people during the free time and evening programs.

### **WHAT IS AN ADULT ASSOCIATE STAFF POSITION?**

- **WORK BEHIND THE SCENES** (18 years or older) Help prepare and serve breakfast and dinner, as well as clean up after meals. They also do other jobs such as emptying trash, take pictures at the worksites and run errands. They will have several hours of free time each day – usually late morning or early afternoon. These adults do not participate in worksite projects.
- **TROUBLE SHOOTERS** (21 years or older) People with experience in construction willing to work at a variety of job sites assisting groups with question/difficulties which arise related to a work project. They also assist the Workcamp Tool Supply Manager, deliver/pick up tools/supplies from worksites and pick up supplies from the local hardware store in the evenings.

**WHAT IS AN ADULT ASSOCIATE STAFF POSITION? (cont.)**

- **NURSE/PARAMEDICS** (21 years or older) Certified medical personnel help at the “home base” whenever a minor medical problem arises (sunburn, twisted ankle, bug bites, etc). This person has the option of being on a work team and going to a worksite or staying at the home base and working behind the scenes with the Workcamp set up.
- **PRIEST** Help with Eucharist celebrations throughout the week and with Reconciliation. Priests are assigned a team and go to worksites, unless they choose to work behind the scenes with the Workcamp staff.

**HOW WILL WE GET TO THE WORKSITES?**

The vehicles your youth group uses to get to the Workcamp will be needed to transport work teams to and from the worksites during the week. Only adults designated by their Parish will drive to worksites. Certain circumstances may arise in which adults without a vehicle could be asked to drive.

**WHAT CAN WE DO ON OUR FREE DAY?**

Everyone is given a well deserved free day to visit local attractions. We will send you a list of what you can do on your free day once your group has registered. Cost of free day activities is not included in the registration fee. Leaders are responsible for their own groups and transportation needs. There will be mass and a program on Friday morning starting at 8:00am.

**WILL WE RECEIVE AN INFORMATION PACKET BEFORE WE ARRIVE?**

Yes, each group will receive a packet that includes Pre-Trip Planning Booklets, applications, medical information/release form, and a “what to bring” list for each camper, plus directions to the Workcamp “base,” list of free day activities and other pertinent information.

**WHAT IF A PARTICIPANT HAS NO PERSONAL MEDICAL INSURANCE?**

All CHWC participants are required to have personal medical insurance coverage. If for some reason a participant does not have health insurance, you may purchase a temporary policy through [www.temporaryinsurance.com](http://www.temporaryinsurance.com).

**HOW DO WE PAY FOR THE WORKCAMP?**

Be creative, persistent and prayerful. Finding finances is not as hard as you think. Set up a budget for registration and travel costs, then brainstorm with your group and parish staff for ideas such as pancake breakfasts, car washes, letter writing campaigns and other activities to raise money. Fundraisers are a great way to build community. Ask each participant, the parish, local businesses and private individuals to help you cover the cost for Workcamp. ### **WHAT ABOUT LIABILITY AND INSURANCE?**

Catholic HEART Workcamp does not allow anyone without personal medical insurance to participate in Workcamp. In the unlikely case medical attention is needed, the participant's personal health insurance is needed to cover any expenses that occur. Catholic HEART Workcamp will employ reputable staff members and take reasonable precautions to safeguard the Workcamp participants during the week of Workcamp. However, neither Catholic HEART Workcamp, social agencies nor the school acting as "home base" will be liable for loss or damage to property of participants prior to, during or following the Workcamp due to theft, fire, accident or any other cause beyond its control. It is the sole responsibility of the participants to obtain insurance at their own expense against property loss, damage or injury and against liability for personal injury.

Catholic HEART Workcamp's liability for injury to persons or loss or damage to property shall be limited to such as may be caused by negligence. The Workcamp participants assume responsibility and agrees to indemnify and defend the Workcamp, employees and agents associated with the Workcamp against any claims and expenses arising from negligence, theft, loss, damage or personal injury. The Catholic HEART Workcamp has limited General Liability coverage.

### **WHAT IS A "NEXT LEVEL" WORKCAMP?**

In addition to the great parts of the original CHWC experience, the "Next Level" Camps offer the following:

- DAILY MORNING MASS
- YOUTH GROUP SHARING TIME
- EUCHARIST ADORATION
- RECONCILIATION (also offered at all camps)
- DAILY ROSARY

The "Next Level" Camps will challenge teens to reflect and grow in their Catholic Faith. "Next Level" does not always mean more challenging work projects. Each camp is different. These camps are open to those entering the 9th, 10th, 11th and 12th grade in the Fall as well as college students and young adults.

### **WHAT IS THE REGISTRATION FEE?**

A \$75.00 deposit is needed to reserve spots. Please note registration prices are the same for both teens and adults.

#### **Policy for Deposits and Refunds**

Please only reserve spaces you can fill. Confirmation will be sent once we receive your deposits. Camps do fill up so reservations are on a first-come, first-served basis. We cannot guarantee or hold reservations over the phone or through e-mail. If you register both males and females, you will need at least one male and female adult leader. \$75.00 holds each person's space (adults and youth). Sorry, this deposit is non-refundable or non-transferable to another member's registration at anytime. However, you can substitute a cancellation with a new participant.
